## We need to be respectful of our history – it shapes, at least, our approach to the future

#### Where did this industry come from?

- Regulators, Patients, Doctors, Cultivators
- Popularity:
  - Patients want access to medicine
  - This does not mean that, by default, it is universally accepted as a good idea
- Illegal background

Being cannabis and being popular is not enough. The supply chain and its stakeholders all have a role to play in ensuring that the sector is trusted and has social licence.

# State of play and impact to global supply chains – reality


What is the consequence of a patchwork of regulation globally?

What about trade - Technical and Non-Technical trade considerations.


